extra bit called the 'coda'. This has the phrase

'Wait and see...' from the end of the chorus sung four times. For the first three times the word 'see'

slips up a note – 'wait and see...'

Nigel But for the fourth time it stays put without

going up and has to be held on quite long, while

the accompaniment slows down.

Joanna Join in with us straight away - I think you'll get

the idea of the coda...
