



Using 'I' and 'me'

The pronoun 'I'

Use this pronoun when the sentence is about you. Be careful with this pronoun because

It sometimes changes the way the verb is written. For example:

Bob says: Jenny **is** going to the job centre.

Jenny says: **I am** going to the job centre.

The pronoun 'me'

Use this pronoun when you are being acted upon by someone or something else. For example:

Please call **me** about the job.

The text below is Jenny's job history. Rewrite it as if you were Jenny, using personal pronouns.

You will need to put in **20 personal pronouns**. Don't forget to change the verb if necessary!

For example, your first sentence will be: '**I am** forty years old'.
