

## Responding to opinions

Listen to the audio clip **Giving an opinion on digital music** to find out what Mike thinks about the growth of digital and free music.

Do you think these statements about Mike's views are true (T) or false (F)?

- 1. Mike's in favour of free music.
- 2. He thinks you listen more times to music if you've paid 79p for it.
- 3. He says sometimes you have to listen 20 times to be able to appreciate the music.

- 8. He doesn't like digital music because you can't hold it in your hand or look at a record sleeve.

No, I don't agree. I think...

Mmm, maybe, but...
