Ordering or sequencing ideas	Adding ideas	Contrasting ideas	Starting a new idea
<p>First of all, work out which area you need to live in to be able to get to work.</p> <p>Then work out your budget - how much can you afford?</p>	<p>Modern houses are comfortable and they're easy to clean.</p>	<p>On the other hand, older houses have more interesting features.</p>	<p>As far as living in the country is concerned...</p> <p>I'm going on to talk about living in the city.</p>
