Reading for hobbies

You can find information about almost any hobby in books, magazines and on the internet.

To find information, it helps to:

- know what information you are looking for
- use an index or contents page to find the right information
- work out key words and phrases
 so that you can scan text for useful information.

Using a contents page

The **contents page** is at the front of a book. It normally lists the chapters, or sections of a book in order, and gives page numbers.

Use the contents page to find general information about what's in each chapter.

An **index** is usually at the back of a book. It is normally in alphabetical order, and lists key words, topics and names, with the page number.

Cookery book indexes often list ingredients as main headings, with recipes listed alphabetically beneath each heading.
