

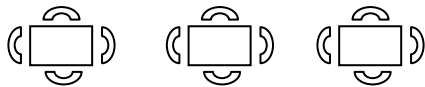
Multiples: everyday examples

Tip: think of sets of chairs around a table.

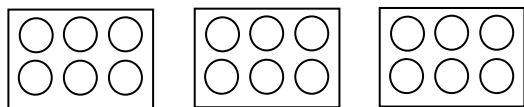


2. Eggs are packed in boxes of 6.
