Measuring lengths in standard metric units

Sometimes you need to measure things accurately. For example:





Measuring a room for a new carpet.

Drawing a plan to fit a new kitchen.

In the examples above it's really important that you take exact measurements - otherwise you might order the wrong amount of carpet or end up with kitchen units that don't fit!

When it's important to be accurate, we usually record the length, height or width of things using standard units of metric measurement. The most commonly used metric units of length are the **millimetre**, **centimetre** and **metre**.

Unit of metric measure	Facts
millimetre	 the word millimetre can be shortened to mm a millimetre is about the size of a needlepoint there are 10 millimetres in a centimetre and 1,000 millimetres in a metre
centimetre	 the word centimetre can be shortened to cm a centimetre is about the width of your little finger a centimetre is the same as 10 millimetres
metre	 the word metre can be shortened to m a metre is roughly the length of your stride a metre is the same as 1,000 millimetres

Remember

- 10 mm = 1 cm
- 1,000 mm = 1 m
