Diagrams and maps

You use plans, diagrams and maps in everyday life. For example, you might use a diagram to help you put a chest of drawers together, a plan to guide you to the nearest till in a shop or a map to find your local school.


A title - this tells you what the plan, diagram or map is for.

Labels - these tell you what different parts mean.

Measurements - these show the lengths on parts of the plan, or the scale on maps.
