Recognising compound words - answers

UK Weather Review: March 2011 Winter returned to Scotland in the second week with strong winds and snow, especially over higher ground. Heavy snow affected travel in parts of the Highlands, with Inverness airport closed for a time and difficult driving conditions on roads. Further **snowfall** over the next few days meant that travel disruption worsened and became more widespread, affecting many parts of central and northern Scotland. A number of routes in the Highlands were closed overnight on the 13th. **Rainfall** was close to or just above normal over eastern and southern **Scotland**, but it was dry **elsewhere**, exceptionally so over much of central and eastern England, where less than 20% of the average March rainfall was recorded. East Anglia had its second driest March since 1910; only 1929 was drier. It was also sunnier than normal across most of the UK, especially Wales, but over Scotland sunshine was closer to normal. Below are the nine compound words in the passage (they are also highlighted in the text above):

Scot + land = Scotland (4 times)	wide + spread = widespread
High + lands = Highlands (2 times)	over + night = overnight
rain + fall = rainfall (2 times)	else + where = elsewhere
air + port = airport	sun + shine = sunshine
snow + fall = snowfall
