








Strategies for reading - answers

	Type of reading		Strategy/strategies
1	A dictionary		You don't need to read every word of a dictionary. You would read it by <b>scanning</b> for the word you wanted.
2	A newspaper		Some people might start reading a newspaper by <b>skimming</b> through to see what is in it. They might then choose an interesting article to read using <b>detailed reading</b> . Others might <b>scan</b> quickly through the paper to find the bit that interests them, such as the football results or their horoscope.
3	A novel		You might <b>skim</b> quickly through a novel to see if it's worth reading, but if you do decide to read it, you would probably use <b>detailed reading</b> so that you can follow the story.
4	A webpage		Most people <b>scan</b> a webpage to see if the information they want is on that page. If it isn't, <b>scanning</b> will help you to find the link you need to move to a different page. When you find the page you want, you might need to read it in more <b>detail</b> .
5	The telephone directory		As with a dictionary, you will not want to read every word. Just <b>scan</b> it to find the telephone number you need.
