People live all over me on bits of land called continents.

There are seven: <u>North America</u> ... <u>South America</u> ... <u>Africa</u> ... <u>Europe</u> ... <u>Asia</u> ... <u>Oceania</u> ... and <u>Antarctica</u>.

Over two-thirds of my surface is covered in <u>water</u>. Most of it is held in the five <u>oceans</u>: <u>The Atlantic Ocean</u> ... <u>The Indian Ocean</u> ... <u>The Pacific Ocean</u> ... <u>The Southern Ocean</u> ... and <u>The Arctic Ocean</u>.

I <u>orbit</u> around the <u>sun</u>. Not that fast! It actually takes me a year.

There's an imaginary line that runs around my middle, which is always closest to the sun.

There it is - the **Equator!**

It marks the difference between my two parts: the <u>Northern Hemisphere</u> and the <u>Southern Hemisphere</u>.

This cold part at the top is my most <u>northern</u> point and is called the <u>North Pole</u>.

I also have another cold part at my bottom - I mean, my most <u>southerly</u> point - which is called the <u>South Pole</u>.

I have a lot going on, don't I?
