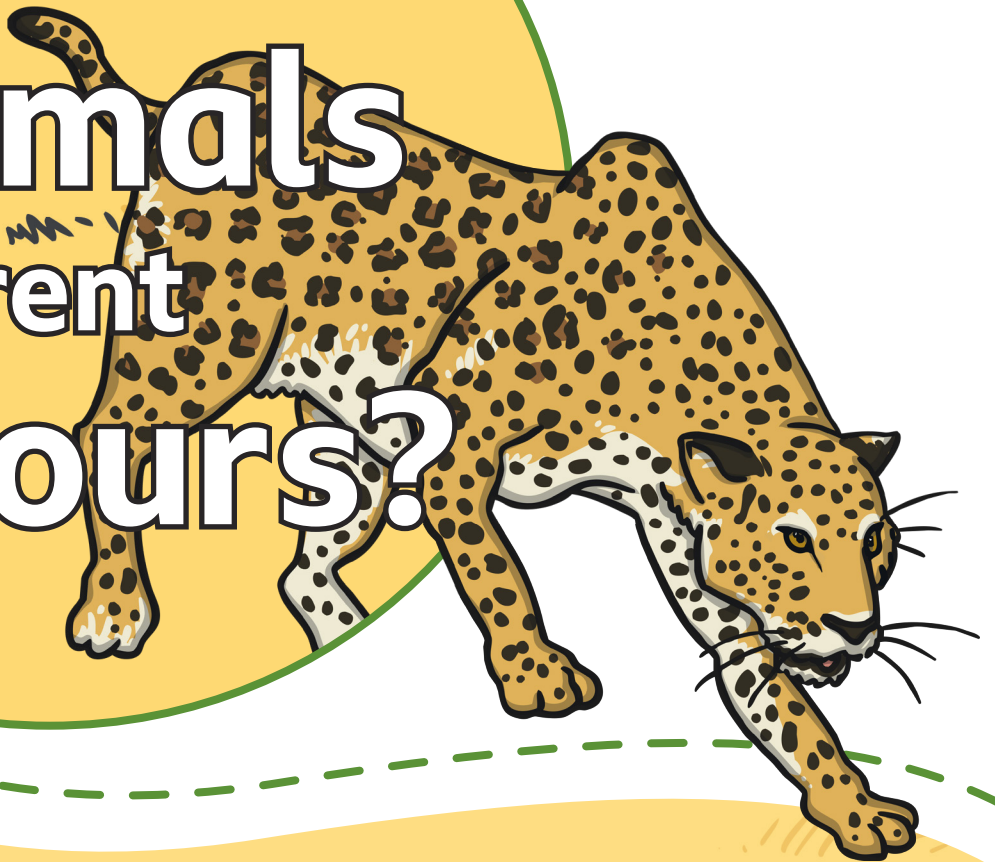

Match each camouflaged animal to its habitat by drawing a line between them.



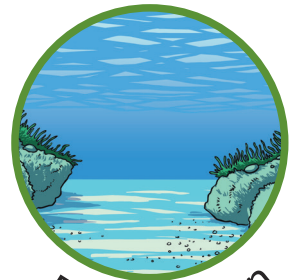

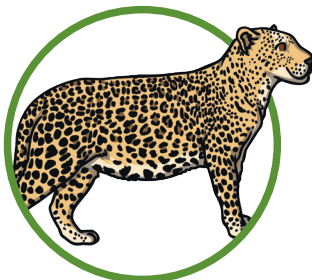
Serengeti forest

The colour of an animal often changes over time to allow it to survive and thrive in its habitat. Colour these animals to show how they look to match their habitats.



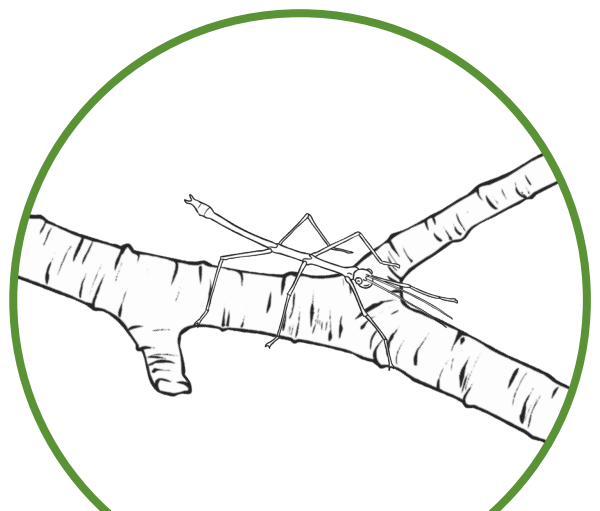
tiger in long grass

# Male and Female Animals

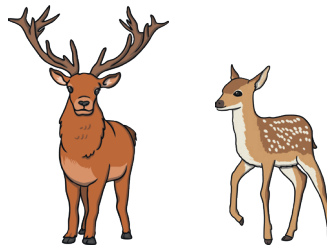
Male and female animals often look different. Circle the male animals below.



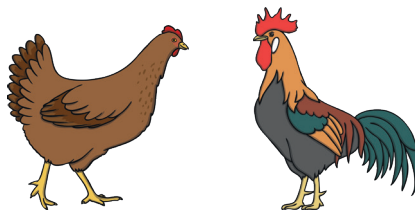
lion and lioness
