

Activity 2: I feel...

In today's Live Lesson, we are each going to be writing our own poem of remembrance, in the form of a haiku.

Haiku is a form of Japanese poetry that has three lines. The first line of a haiku has five syllables, the second line has seven syllables and the third has five syllables.

Syllables are chunks of sound that make up a word. For example:

hap- py – 'happy' has two syllables
fas-ci-na-ted – 'fascinated' has four syllables

Use some (or a few) of the emotion words you've chosen in Activity 1 to create the first line of your haiku.

Remember to use just five syllables. You can use the template below to help you.

Write each syllable on a different line to check that you have only **five** syllables.
