## Converting from minutes to hours

Sometimes time is given in minutes rather than hours and minutes. For example, if you use the internet to search for details on a film you want to see, it will often give you the time in minutes.

Another example is phone cards.
Look at these minutes offered by a phone card company:


How many minutes of calls to Taiwan do you get?
Is it more than an hour? Is it more than 2 hours?
You get 200 minutes of calls to Hong Kong. How many hours and minutes is that?
What about Turkey?
For Taiwan you get 87 minutes of calls. There are 60 minutes in an hour.
Two hours would be $2 \times 60=120$ minutes .
So 87 minutes is more than an hour but less than 2 hours. In fact if you subtract 60 from 87 you get 27 minutes. So the calls to Taiwan can take 1 hour 27 minutes.

For Hong Kong find out how many times 60 divides into the 200 minutes.

$$
3 \times 60=180
$$

so...
$200 \div 60=3$ (with 20 minutes left over). So you get 3 hours and 20 minutes to Hong Kong.
For Turkey you get 55 minutes. This is 5 less than 60 . So you get 5 minutes less than one hour of calls to Turkey.

You could also use a number line that goes up in multiples of sixty to help:

| Hours | 0 | 1 | 2 | 3 | 4 | 5 |
| :--- | :--- | :--- | :--- | :--- | :--- | :--- |
| Minutes | 0 | 60 | 120 | 180 | 240 | 300 |
