




Extracting information from a list

The written list is a common way to represent information: for example, prices of food might be listed in a menu.

Joe's Snack Menu

If you want to find the information from the list you can either search down the whole list or go straight to the relevant section. For example, if you want to find out the price of a cup of tea, go to the drinks section and read off the price (£0.50 or 50p).
