
EXAMPLE 3 ACT STORY






The child confronts the grown-up, or breaks the unfair rule.

FOR EXAMPLE: by jumping into a muddy puddle.





FOR EXAMPLE: The grown up says "you're allowed to go outside in your new shoes incase you get them muddy."







This is where we see the ${\bf consequences}$ for breaking the rule.

FOR EXAMPLE: The child gets a punishment



Introduce a child main character and start with something interesting.

FOR EXAMPLE: They've just got some shiny new trainers.



Finally, show what the character thinks at the end of the story. Did the punishment change them, will they never do it again? It depends on what your character is like.

FOR EXAMPLE: They cheekily get their little sister to do the punishment for them!



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
