Follow conductor's cue for entrances at each of these locations. It will take some practice if you're not used to following a conductor, so I recommend rehearsing with the conductor before you have the first rehearsal with the group.

Measure numbers have been marked as (m.1) etc. so that the conductor knows how your music aligns with theirs. What is written as (m.1) would be spoken as "measure one" or sometimes "bar one" in rehearsal.
