

Tempo is measured in beats per minute (BPM). The pulse of the music controls the tempo. Italian words are often used to describe tempo.

The tempo can change during a piece of music.

Italian	English
accelerando (accel.)	gradually getting quicker
rallentando (rall.)	gradually getting slower
ritardando (rit.)	gradually getting slower
a tempo	return to original tempo

How loudly or quietly music should be played

Italian words and abbreviations are used for dynamics in music.


Symbol	Italian	English
pp	pianissimo	very quiet
p	piano	quiet
m_p	mezzo piano	moderately quiet
mf	mezzo forte	moderately loud

Symbol	Italian	English
f	forte	loud
ff	fortissimo	very loud
<<	crescendo	getting louder
>	diminuendo	getting quieter




Rhythm


Patterns of sounds that have different durations, played in time with the pulse








In a song, the verse could be A and the chorus B.








Rondo form

The double bass is LARGE and can play very LOW sounds

Thin

Monophonic

A single melody, with no harmony

Homophonic

Melody with harmony

Polyphonic

Two or more independent melodies

A word we use to describe the character or colour of a musical sound

Timbre is pronounced: TAM-bruh
