# What's in our festive shopping bag?





WHAT: This simple matching game can help children link the name of an item to the object that they can see.

WHY: Talking about and naming items that little ones are interested in can help them learn words quicker.

HOW: Look at and name the items in the box. Point at or draw a line to match the pictures to the silhouettes.

## Top tips for younger children

- Play 'What's in the bag?' with your shopping.
- Keep a few items in your bag.
- -Say "Shake, shake, shake, what's in the bag? Let's look and see".
- -Pull an item out of the bag and name it.

# Top tips for older children

- Play 'What's in the bag?' with your shopping.
  - -Say "Shake, shake, shake, what's in the bag? Let's look and see".
  - -Ask your child 'What's in the bag?' Get them to find an item and describe what they can feel.
  - -Ask questions whilst they are feeling the item in the bag e.g. "Is it big or small?" "Is it hard or soft?"












# Festive food matching game BECTINY HAPPY PEOPLE

You could talk about each item e.g. "This one is red, small and round and this one is the same. They are both cherries. They match!"







# Can you help Santa get dressed?



WHAT: It is a great idea to talk about parts of the body and clothing you might wear in winter.

WHY: This can help your child hear new words as you talk about what we wear and where it goes on our bodies.

# **How to play**

- Look at the picture of Santa.
   On the left hand side is an outline of Santa and on the right hand side is his missing clothes. Let's help Santa get dressed.
- 2. Talk about the items and where they go e.g. "Gloves go on hands".
- **3.** Point to and draw a line to where the clothes belong on Santa's body.
- 4. Draw Santa's missing clothes and colour them all in.



# Top tips

Talk about the type of winter clothes you wear when you go outdoors, what they feel like and where they go on your body. You could also count the items as you get dressed e.g. count two gloves, two fluffy socks, one hat and one big coat.

# **Festive I Spy**







WHAT: Have some festive fun playing 'I Spy'. Talk about what you can see and hear when you're out and about this winter.

WHY: It's a great way to help develop your little one's attention and listening skills and introduce them to new words as they look at and listen to things around them.

### Game 1

- 1. Choose one item at a time from the box and play 'I Spy'.
- Talk about the item and describe how and where you wear it. See if your little one can guess what it is.
- E.g. "I Spy ...something you put on your head"
  Answer: Hat
- 3. Draw a circle around the things that you have seen today.











# Make an origami gnome

B B C TINY HAPPY PEOPLE


Using a square piece of paper, create and decorate your gnome!













2. Unfold flat

3. Take the left corner and fold inwards to centre line

4. Repeat with the right corner

5. Fold the longer point down to meet the opposite











6. Flip it over so the flat edge is at the bottom

7. Fold the top corner down and make a neat crease

8. Make another small fold - a few mm wide - for the gnome's hat

9. Flip it over and fold back the edges

decorate!

When finished, drop your gnome in the post box in store and your ASDA Community Champion will send them to the local community.
